The Monday Group

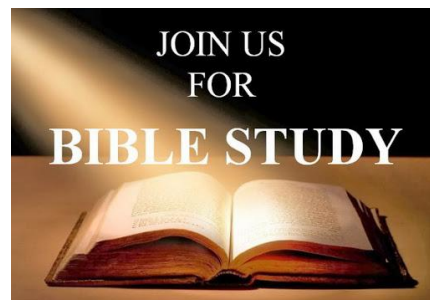
This group is in keeping with St. Andrew Women's objective; to serve others.

About Us

St. Andrew United Methodist Church is a warm, welcoming congregation in Bechtelsville, PA. Our Sunday worship blends traditional hymns with contemporary praise music in a supportive, family-like atmosphere. We are seeking a reliable musician to join our worship team.



Position Overview

We are seeking a part-time pianist/keyboard player to provide musical accompaniment for Sunday worship services. This position is well-suited for music students, teachers, semi-retired musicians, or anyone seeking a meaningful part-time ministry opportunity.

Responsibilities

- Provide piano/keyboard accompaniment for worship (typically 2–3 hymns and 4 contemporary songs per service)
- Collaborate with our praise team on contemporary worship music
- Attend weekly rehearsals (approximately 1.5 hours)
- Arrive 45 minutes before Sunday service for warm-up and coordination

Schedule

- Sunday worship: 9:45–10:45 a.m. (arrival at 9:00 a.m.)
- Weekly rehearsal: 1.5 hours, typically Wednesday evenings, 7:15–8:30 p.m. (flexible based on availability)

Compensation: \$75–\$85 per week, based on experience

Qualifications

- Proficiency in piano/keyboard
- Ability to read music, chord charts, or lead sheets
- Willingness to play both traditional hymns and contemporary worship styles
- Reliable, team-oriented, and committed to consistent weekly participation
- Trial period of 2–3 weeks to ensure a good mutual fit

Our mission team has decided to collect food again for the Salvation Army. We will collect one non-perishable food item a month to help them throughout the year.

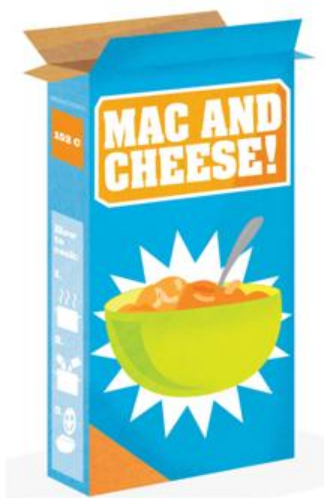
The item for February is Boxed Mac & Cheese and Canned or Shelf Stable Milk. Please place them in the shopping cart in the Welcome Center.

Making Our Way Together

Lent is a season of reflection, repentance, and renewal—a time when we slow down and make space for God to shape us. Traditionally, Lent is a forty-day journey inviting us to examine our lives and walk more intentionally in God's ways.

This year, our Lenten series is called *The Way*, created by Worship Design Studio and inspired

by the film of the same name and by the many biblical images of roads, paths, and journeys. Scripture is filled with people on the move—Abraham leaving home, Israel wandering in the wilderness, disciples following Jesus on dusty roads. God says through the prophet Isaiah, “I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert” (Isaiah 43:19). Even in places that feel empty or confusing, God is always creating a path forward.

A key image for this season is pilgrimage. For centuries, people of faith have made intentional journeys as a way to pray with their feet and listen with their whole selves. The movie *The Way* tells the story of a father who walks the Camino de Santiago in honor of his son, discovering healing along the road. It reminds us that the journey itself can be sacred.

As one reflection says, “When we explore and embrace deliberate slow rituals, we experience a kind of sacred time not accessible in our everyday existence” (Calm App Reflection). Lent invites us into that slower, more intentional way of living.

Our weekly themes will guide us:

- “The Way Back” – Ash Wednesday
- “The Wandering Way” – Lent One
- “The High Way” – Lent Two
- “The Way Around” – Lent Three
- “The Way Home” – Lent Four
- “The Free Way” – Lent Five
- “The Other Way” – Lent Six / Palm Sunday
- “The Loving Way” – Holy Week
- “Make Your Way” – Easter Sunday

Each week we will explore how God meets us on every kind of road—when we feel lost, when the path is steep, when we circle in confusion, and when love calls us to walk differently.

We encourage you to watch the movie *The Way*, which will help frame our weekly themes. Our journey begins on **Ash Wednesday, February 18th, at 10:30 a.m.** Come as you are to watch the movie, receive ashes, and begin Lent with prayer and intention.

This Lent, we invite you to **experience our walking path in a new way**. Along the path, you will find simple prompts to guide prayer and reflection. As you walk, gently gather small items from nature—pinecones, leaves, acorns, seeds, stones, or anything that catches your eye. Bring them to the pavilion and add them to our growing nature mosaic. Each small offering becomes part of something larger, showing our shared journey as a community.

Whether you come alone, with a friend, or with your family, this interactive path is an invitation to slow down, notice, and pray. This Lent, we are not just talking about the journey—we are walking it. Together, let us trust that God is already making a way.

In closing, I'd like to thank you in advance for believing in me and for your prayers and support. Thank you, and I will be sure to report back on our trip when we return.
