

Our next meeting will take place on **November 21**st at noon in the church library. Note the date change because of Thanksgiving. See you there.





The Monday Group

On September 30, Rania Metry, a representative of Operation Christmas Child (OCC), picked up the items The Monday Group gathered and made for this year's campaign. As you may know, The Monday Group is a part of Saint Andrew Women. Making and gathering items for OCC is a big part of what we do. The Group's main project is to make cloth draw string bags. The 5"x12" bags will be filled with school supplies. Most of these were made of felt, which is a strong fabric. The 5"x9" bags will be filled with personal items like soap, tooth brushes, wash cloth, etc. The bags of various sizes will be filled with stuffed animals, match-box type cars, ornaments for girls' hair, toys, etc.



At the beginning of November, Ms. Metry will have a "packing party" at her church. Everything gathered from multiple churches will be laid out on tables and individuals will take an OCC shoes box, walk down beside the tables and select the appropriate things for each box. Boxes will have been marked "girl or boy" along with the appropriate age group. Ms. Metry told us she expects to fill 2,000+ boxes this year.

Be a Blessing to some of our neighbors who are in need.



On October 3rd our missionary, Patrick Abro, along with several other missionaries serving in various countries around the world, did a zoom presentation about his work in Burundi.

Patrick shared the following goals for his work in Burundi:

Our objective is to reach by 2031,

- 10 health centers built and equipped to relieve the population, especially pregnant women and children under 5 years old,
- 100 boreholes to provide clean water to populations of Burundi,
 - 50 latrines for hygiene,
 - 50 clubs against malaria,
- Mobilize and train 15,000 religious and community leaders against malaria, HIV, tuberculosis, and for maternal and child health

Please keep me in prayer your contributions are very important to demonstrate God's love for the people of Burundi

The Health Center of Gahambwe will soon be open. It serves a population of 27,000 people and focuses on maternal and pediatric care for children up to 5 years of age. It is supported by Global Health/Global Ministries. (see picture above right)

This is the devotional shared by Patrick Abro:

REFLECTION

'Peace be with you'. Luke 24:36

The disciples know that the tomb is empty because the women were there. Peter and John who went to the tomb have reported the news that Jesus has risen. But his 2 disciples were still sad on the road. It took the physical presence of Jesus and for him to say 'Peace be with you'. This greeting is full of meaning, because with this word 'peace' Jesus removed the sadness and turmoil from his disciples. Jesus himself is called the Prince of Peace in Isaiah 9:5. He is peace.

Like Jesus, Peter used the word 'peace' to greet Christians in his various letters to the churches. The apostle Paul used it to greet the churches in these letters and even to some of his close friends like Timothy, Titus and Philemon. This has continued to this day. To greet someone, the Jews say 'Shalom', which means peace, but here in Burundi we greet by saying 'Amahoro', which also means peace, because peace is the greatest good we can wish for each other. Peace is the greatest good we can give to our neighbors. It is the greatest good we can wish for all people everywhere in the world: in Ukraine, Palestine, Lebanon, Israel because of the war, in the United States because of the disasters caused by the hurricane called 'Helene', causing death and suffering, also in Burundi, which is suffering tornadoes and disasters, and all around us the challenges of people who are suffering in different ways.

Yes, let us seek peace, let us do as Jesus our Lord did, who desires peace and gives it, yes, by our actions and our commitment, let us offer peace. For peace means: the state of a person that nothing disturbs, so living in peace means: the state of one who lives in calm, rest and tranquility. It means living without conflict, without war, without pain, without poverty, without worry, without violence, without injustice, without persecution, without suffering of any kind for lack of: shelter, blankets, clean water, health care, food, school kits, etc. All people, like us, want to experience the peace of Jesus, to be free and happy in this world and for eternity. We must not be silent before so many suffering hearts. Let our greetings and our actions promote peace. This will be the sign of our love for Jesus, and of our love for others according to God.

May God help us,

AMAHORO... Peace be with you. AMEN
